Enrollment: 340 (173 boys, 167 girls). While 87% of students are Catholic, children of all faiths are welcome.

Faculty and Class Size: 23 teachers, 21:1 student-teacher ratio. We do our best to hold class size to 25 students. Currently all grades except 3rd have two classes.

ISTEP+ Scores: St. Matthew has consistently received an Exemplary Rating from the State of Indiana, the highest designation schools can be given. In Spring 2012, 96% of students passed the English/Language Arts portion of ISTEP, and 94% passed Math.

Transportation: While we do not offer bus service, students are brought to school by parents, and many parents work together to carpool.

Daily Schedule: School starts at 7:50 a.m. and ends at 3:00 p.m. Students may arrive in classrooms at 7:30 a.m. Free morning care is available for students who need to be dropped off between 7:00 a.m. and 7:30 a.m. After-School Extended Care is available from 3-6 p.m. at a current cost of \$3 per hour.

Uniforms: Navy or khaki pants with red polo-style shirts is the attire for students. Khaki or navy shorts are allowed at certain times of the year. On Mass days girls in K-3 wear plaid jumpers, and girls in Grades 4-8 wear plaid skirts/skorts, and may wear those on other days, as well.

Extras offered: All SMS students participate in art, music, computer, and PE classes each week, and library time is available. Middle School students have those classes plus additional enrichment in band and fitness. Our Parent-Faculty Association (PFA) also sponsors many different club opportunities.

Sports Offered: CYO football and wrestling begins in 3rd grade for boys. Other CYO sports for Grades 4-8 include cross country (co-ed), volleyball (girls), basketball (boys and girls), kickball (girls), track (co-ed), baseball (boys), softball (girls), soccer (co-ed), and cheerleading (girls 5th -8th).

Faith Formation: Mass is attended weekly on Wednesdays. All grades have regular Religion classes. First Reconciliation and First Communion instruction is provided in 2nd grade. Other Sacraments are encouraged for all students and families.
